It's correct that the award is mentioned in the lead, as it should be, though the layout and information needs to be tightened. I'm not a fan of infoboxes, and any wording there has to be concise but avoid any exaggeration. The only source we've got is your PSU bio which says "He shared the Nobel Peace Prize with other IPCC authors in 2007." It would help immensely if you could point out any independent reliable online sources such as news articles that cover this award to you: blogs aren't any good for this purpose.

More detail is needed in the body of the article. In your book p. 176 says in 2007 lead authors got a plaque, which is presumably what's in the picture, do you have a figure for how many lead authors there were? You add that at a meeting celebrating the Nobel prize you with Ben Santer were singled out by Susan Solomen for special commendation. The footnote p. 139 says this was at an IPCC conference held in Honolulu in 2009. I've tried searching for independent coverage of this commendation, but couldn't find any: can you point to a source?
